The Gorilla Family in the Mountain

In the Democratic Republic of Congo, there lives a family of mountain gorillas. This vast Virunga's Park in Africa is where 380 gorillas live. They live on the slopes of Mount Mikeno. Innocent Mburanumwe and Diddy Mwanaki are two brave Congolese rangers. They have dedicated their lives to protecting and saving the endangered gorillas.

In June 2007, Innocent and Diddy received news about a missing baby gorilla named Miza. Miza, born on August 12, 2005, was lost in the forest. Being almost two years old, her gorilla father searched. Kabirizi, a fierce silverback, led and protected thirty-one gorillas in his family. Kabirizi was known for his leadership, skills, and bravery.

Lessinjina was Miza's mother. The baby would cling to her mother's back or cradle on her front. Sometimes, Miza would play tag, bounce on the branches, and wrestle with the older juveniles. Miza's strong bond with her mother was like all baby mountain gorillas. She needed her mother's milk until age three. Then, Miza would begin eating roots, flowers, bamboo shoots, and other plants on her own.

Then, one day, the rangers heard that Miza and her mother Lessinjina were missing. Kabirizi moved his family up high into the mountain to hide. Kabirizi searched for several days in feeding areas and quiet hiding places. On one quiet nap time afternoon, Innocent noticed an eye peeping through the leaves. It was Miza, and Kabirizi took her home. Sadly, Lessinjina was never found.
