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FIFTH ANNUAL ABILITIES AWARENESS WEEK IS COMING TO VOORHEES TOWNSHIP APRIL 5TH THROUGH APRIL12TH

(Voorhees, NJ – March 19, 2014) SPEAK (Special needs Parents, Educators And Kids of Voorhees) invites the entire community to participate in a week-long celebration of abilities during its Fifth Annual Abilities Awareness Week, to be held from April 5th through April12th, 2014. SPEAK will offer programs and activities throughout the area and in the schools to promote understanding and acceptance of individuals with disabilities. The 2014Abilities Awareness Week to raise public awareness of the challenges faced by the disabled in their daily lives is sponsored by the Center for Neurological and Neurodevelopmental Health (CNNH), the Voorhees Pediatric Facility, and Rosenblatt Roofing.

"This event is about awareness and acceptance" says Dr. Karen Scardigli, Abilities Awareness Week founder. "Although great strides have been made to increase and improve on programs for people with special needs, we still have a way to go in changing attitudes and getting rid of stigma and misunderstanding."

"This program promotes community awareness and acceptance of the unique abilities that all our children have whether they have special needs or are typical," observes Dominic Luzi, this year's Abilities Awareness Week Chair. "We reached a five-year high in the number of children entering our school poster contest last year, and the interest at the middle school level continues to climb." SPEAK will announce the winning posters during Abilities Awareness Week.

Abilities Awareness Week will approach the finish line on Saturday morning April 12th with SPEAK's Third Annual All Abilities 5K Run and One Mile Run/Walk/Wheel at the Eastern Regional High School, 1401 Laurel Oak Rd, Voorhees Township, NJ 08043. This fundraising event is for both serious and recreational runners. Families are

The elementary schools will present age-appropriate information on the disabled and encourage understanding Voorhees Middle School offers sixth graders the opportunity to and inclusion. experience the challenges of their disabled peers first hand on designated "Abilities Awareness Days," as the popular interactive exhibit, now expanded to two days, returns to the school on Wednesday, April 9th and Thursday 10th. In addition to the hands on event we will be joined by Dr. William Ziegler an Apple Distinguished Educator who will demonstrate how he uses leading edge educational technology in his classroom. This presentation will include iPads, phones and best of breed applications developed for the special needs classroom. Exhibitors include Voorhees Pediatric Facility, Just 2 Moms, The Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, the Learning Resource Center, PATH and Voorhees Township Public Schools Special Services. With the help of these individuals and organizations, the students face physical challenges by performing tasks with assigned disabilities, and confront familiar learning skills through the eyes of a child with various learning disabilities. Eastern Regional High School is planning a week of instruction on what it is like to live with disabilities. Local parents of children with special needs are invited to the school on Tuesday, April 8thtospeak with twelfth grade students, share experiences and answer questions.
