# Narrative Poetry

- Tells a story and has characters
- Is about fictional or real events and can read like a story
  - May be written in stanzas

## Comprehension Skill: Theme

- The theme of a poem is the main message or lesson that a poet wants to communicate.
- Identifying key details in a poem can help you determine the theme.
- Ask yourself, "What message does the poet want to get across to the reader?"

### Vocabulary Strategy: Connotation and Denotation

- Connotation is a feeling or idea associated with a word.
- Denotation is the dictionary's definition of a word.
