#### The Judicial Branch

- The leaders of the Judicial Branch are 9 justices (Supreme Court). After being appointed and approved they serve for the rest of their lives.

#### The Executive Branch



- The leader of the Executive Branch is the President. After going through Election, they serve one term for 4 years. If the people like the decisions the President makes, they can re-elect the same President for another term (another 4 years) and a total of 8 years.
- He signs or vetoes bill to laws. He is in charge of the Marines, Army, and the Navy
- The place the President and his family lives is the White House.

- The leader of the Legislative Branch is Congress.(House of Representatives, and the Senate.) Representatives serve for 2 years. Senators serve for 6 years.
