The theme for the 2023-2024 school year is Building Pathways to Success: Empowering Students through Positive Connections. This theme centers around the crucial connection between positive relationships and successful outcomes.

Throughout the summer, we have diligently prepared for the upcoming school year, with several important tasks completed:

- Created pacing guides for the K to 5 Spanish program.
- Developed the Spanish curriculum for grades K to 3 for the entire year (grades K to 2 will be taught by the homeroom teacher, while grades 3 to 5 will be taught by a certified Spanish teacher).
- Designed the Spanish curriculum for grades 4 and 5 for marking period 1.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Recording Attendance for the 2023-2024 School Year: Absences in Genesis Will No Longer Default as an Excused Absence

Effective September 1, 2023

In order to comply better with the attendance recording guidelines set by the New Jersey Department of Education and ensure accuracy in reporting, we are making a change to our attendance practices. Starting from September 1, 2023, we will no longer use the terms "excused" and "unexcused" when documenting absences in the Genesis system. Instead, we will solely use the term "absence."

Please note that the school nurse and school secretary will continue to upload parent/guardian notes into the Genesis system to document absences approved by parents/guardians. However, the NJDOE only recognizes limited reasons for excused absences. According to New Jersey's approved Elementary Secondary School Act (ESSA) State plan, a state-excused absence cannot be counted as a day in membership. For example, if a kindergarten student misses only one school day for Take Our Children to Work Day out of 180 possible days of attendance, the cumulative days in membership for that student must be submitted as 179 days with 179 cumulative days present.

The following are the five allowable reasons for a state-excused absence:

- 1. Religious observance (N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3(h)); https://www.nj.gov/education/holidays20222023.shtml
- 2. A college visit (up to 3 days per school year for students in grades 11 and 12);
- 3. "Take Our Children to Work Day" or other rule issued by the Commissioner;
- 4. Participation in observance of Veterans Day (N.J.S.A. 18A: 36-13.2) or district board of election membership activities (N.J.S.A. 18A: 36-33); or
- 5. The closure of a busing district prevents a student from having transportation to the receiving school.

While the Voorhees Public Schools acknowledges that notes serve as documentation for "parent/guardian-approved absences," it is crucial to note that the Principal is required to inform the Superintendent if these absences become excessive.

Parent/guardian-approved absences refer to those absences with a valid reason that have been communicated in writing by a parent/guardian to the school. Examples of such absences typically include student illness or other medical conditions, as well as family emergencies.

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) defines chronic absenteeism as a student missing 10% or more of their cumulative days in membership. It is important to note that all absences, except for the five NJDOE-approved absences mentioned earlier, are included in the calculation for chronic absenteeism, regardless of any documentation provided by a parent/guardian. With this in mind, the district will maintain open lines of communication with parents to address absenteeism when a student reaches 5, 10, and 18 absences. The purpose of this communication is to provide necessary support as required.
