Dear Parents/Guardians:

This letter is to inform you that an individual at Osage Elementary School reported testing positive for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) on January 29, 2021. The individual was last in school on January 25, 2021. The District coordinated and worked closely with public health officials and followed CDC, state, and local health department guidance in order to assure the health and safety of our community. Due to the factors in this instance, no additional individuals will be required to quarantine.

Cleaning and disinfecting of all exposed areas was completed. The District continues taking precautions to prevent the introduction and spread of viruses and other germs and is cleaning frequently touched surfaces daily. The District has also utilized the ultraviolet sanitation equipment in all of our schools nightly. The status of this situation is fluid, and we are monitoring it closely.

We understand the level of concern regarding COVID-19. We encourage parents and students to continue following the [Centers for Disease Control & Prevention](#) promoted safeguards, such as:

- Staying home when you are sick;
- Washing hands often;
- Covering coughs and sneezes and properly disposing of tissues;
- Limiting close contact with people who are sick and not sharing food, drinks and utensils;
- Practicing social distancing (staying at least 6 feet apart);
- Wearing a face covering while in school; and
- Continuing to monitor your health for symptoms.
